We call on local, state, and federal leaders to recognize Children's Therapy Center's important role in our communities as a medical and educational services provider, and a champion of kids and families. Since 1979 we have worked as a partner in our communities, serving children with special needs and helping kids and families reach their full potential. We strive to protect our ability to continue to serve kids with special needs, and their families and caregivers in a safe and inclusive environment.
