Autism is not an illness or a disease that needs to be cured; it is a different and valid way of being human

Children don't "get" autism they are born autistic; a child does not "outgrow" autism with enough time or treatment

We don't know what causes autism, but it is likely genetic; nothing parents do causes their child to become autistic

Anyone can be autistic regardless of race, gender, age, or socioeconomic status (it does not only occur in white boys)

Sensory differences are common in autistic people; the world can be overwhelming and difficult to navigate without support

Autism is a spectrum of varying strengths, differences, and challenges; no two people experience autism the same way

Autistic people think and learn differently and tend to have strong interests in very specific things

Autistic people process and use language differently; autistic children often start talking later than other kids

Autistic people move their bodies differently and may have difficulty with gross and fine motor skills

Autistic people want to socialize and interact with others, but their sensory differences often make it challenging
